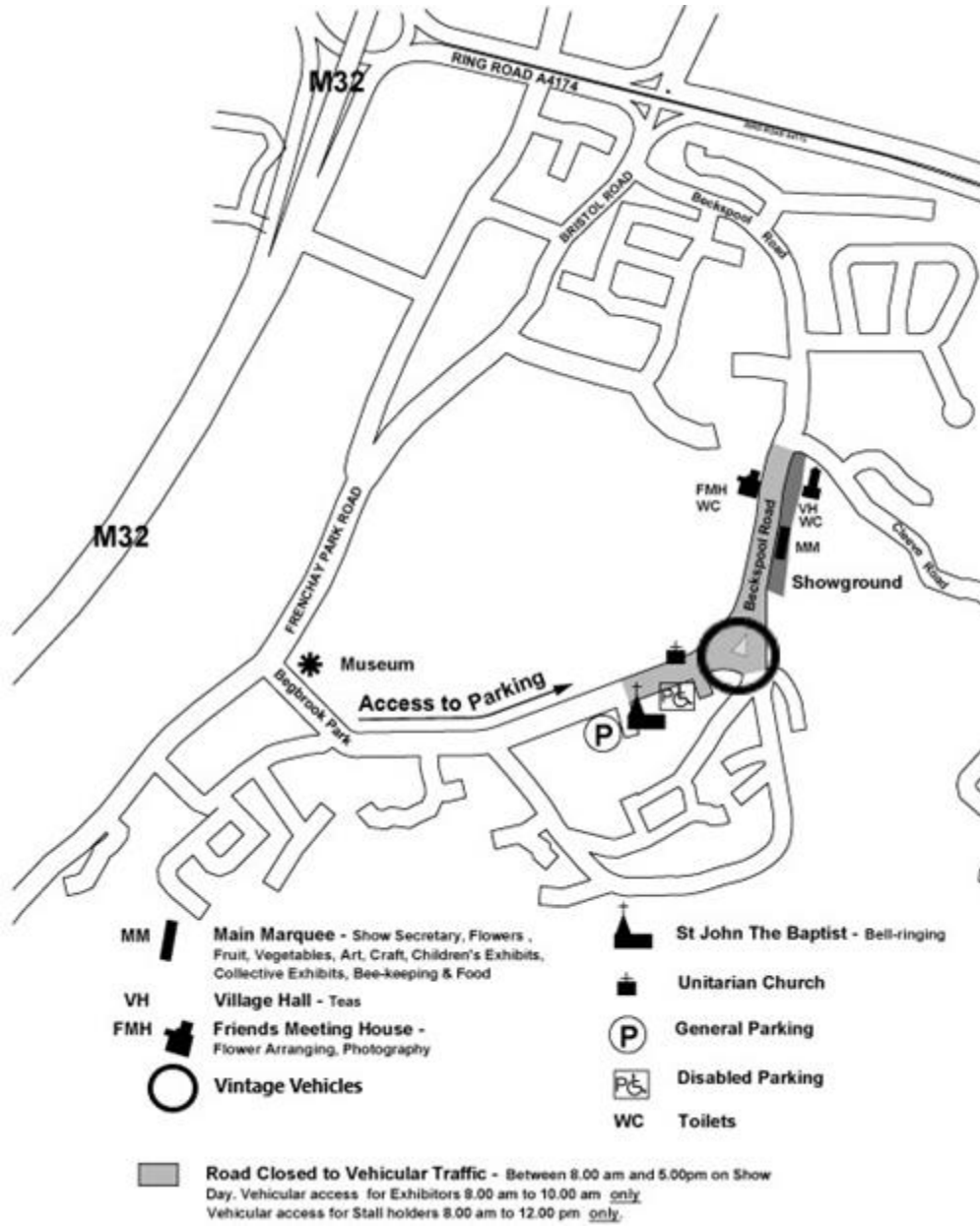

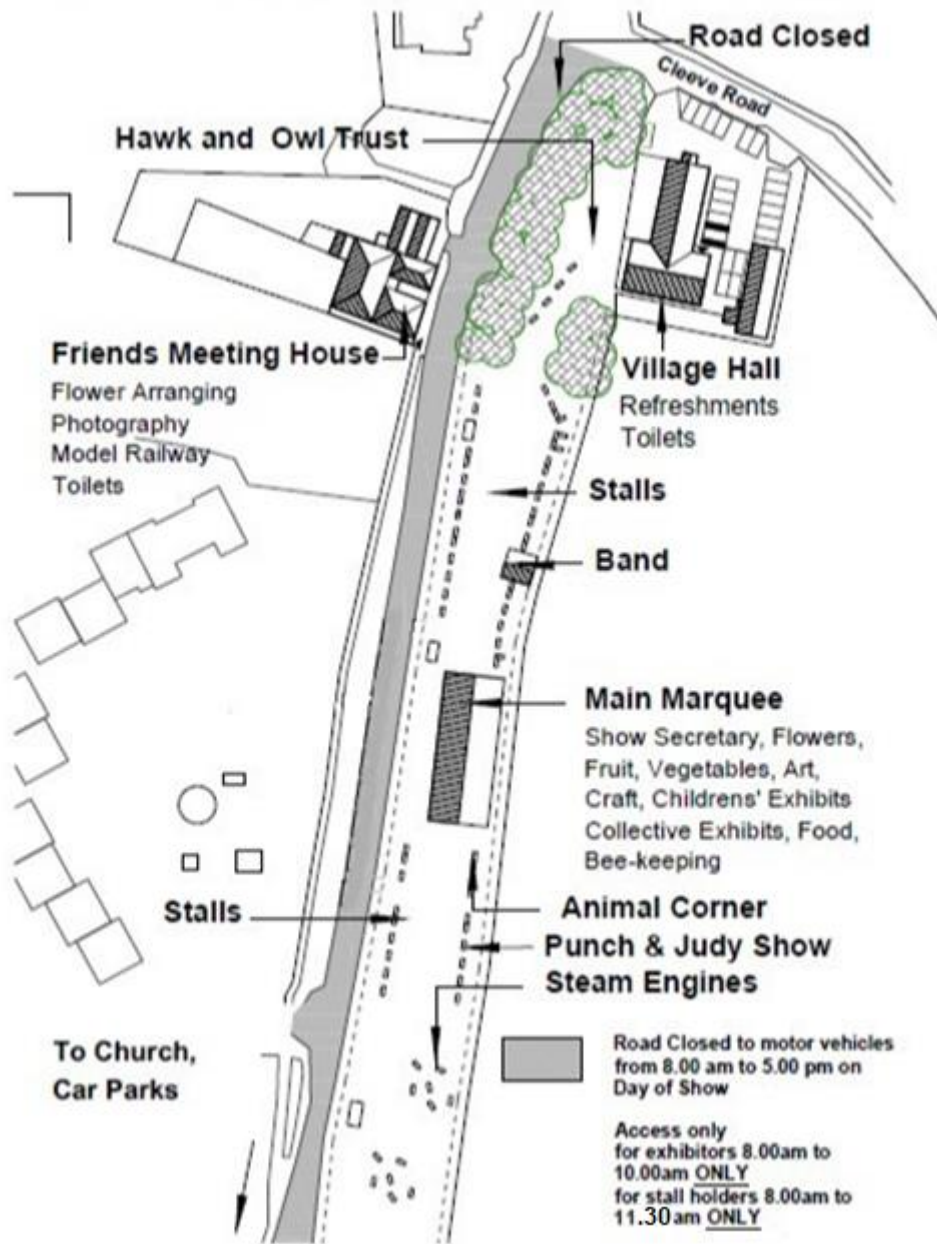

MEMBERS AND EXHIBITORS

HOW TO ENTER

You do not need to be a resident of Frenchay to enter - anyone can compete

You will need to:-

- 1. Fill out an Entry Form** (available from the Website www.frenchayflowershow.com or from the June issue of Frenchay Community News).
- 2. Return Entry Forms** – you can do this via an email to entries@frenchayflowershow.com or deliver to one of the 4 addresses on the Entry Form. Please note that for classes **198-199** and **215-223**, your entry form *and* photographic exhibit must be received by 6pm Wednesday 12th July at one of the addresses on the entry form. For classes **58-65** and **200-204** entry forms must be received by 6pm on Wednesday 12th July at either one of the addresses or sent via email. For **all other classes**, you can return your entry form to the addresses or email address by 6pm Wednesday 12th July, or you can bring your entry form to the show marquee between 4pm and 8pm on Friday 14th July.
- 3. Deliver your Exhibit(s)** - Exhibit cards will be issued either on the Friday before the Show from 4pm – 8pm or on the morning of the Show from 8am – 9.55am.

***NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED ***

PLEASE READ THE RULES and ask the Show Secretary about anything which is not clear. Allow plenty of time to arrange your exhibits. Start on Friday evening if possible. Exhibits must be finished by 9.55am on Saturday. Arrange each exhibit attractively. Flowers should be cut with long stalks and put straight into deep water (e.g. a bucket or jug) until wanted. Flowers may be partially arranged at home or packed carefully and arranged at the Show. Leave short stalks on soft fruit.

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This year there are 27 trophies to be won, with over 150 classes to enter. The classes range from traditional vegetables, fruit and flowers to cakes, jams, and savoury flans. Not forgetting to mention beekeeping, photography, arts and handicrafts, and the fantastic display of arranged cut flowers. So there is something for everyone, including 29 classes for children and local schools to enter. And this year, all entries are **Free!** All you have to do is submit an Entry Form in advance so that we know how many entries to expect.

The Show Committee appeals to the generosity of Exhibitors to leave as much produce as possible for the Auction Sale at approximately 5pm.

Winners will receive a Certificate and children will also receive a rosette to wear.

SHOW RULES

1. **RESPONSIBILITY.** The Show Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits or personal property. Exhibitors must provide all material for staging including dishes, bowls and vases. Benching only will be provided except where otherwise stated. Exhibitors wishing to retain their exhibits must remove them between 4.30pm and 5pm but NOT BEFORE 4.30pm. Exhibits not removed by 5pm will be sold at the Auction for the benefit of Show funds.

2. **OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS.** All exhibits in the Vegetable, Fruit and Flower Classes must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been grown on land in his/her/their occupation. Exhibits in the Food, Beekeeping, Handicrafts, Children's and Floral Arrangement Sections must be the work of the Exhibitor. Exhibits in the Photographic Section must have been taken by the Exhibitor but professional processing is allowed. Exhibits in the Handicrafts Section must not have been shown in previous years.

3. **STAGING.** Exhibits may be staged between 4.00pm and 8pm on the evening before the show and between 8am and 9.55am on the day of the Show at which latter time all persons, except those retained by the Show Committee for official duties must leave the exhibition areas (Friends Meeting House & marquee on adjacent common). From 9.55am to 4.30pm no exhibit may be altered or removed except with permission of the Show Secretary. Please see RHS Guidelines on their website if more information is required.

4. **RIGHT OF ENTRY.** You do not need to live in Frenchay to enter. The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without giving any reason or explanation.

5. **EXHIBIT CARDS.** Exhibit Cards (obtainable from the Show Secretary's Office in the Main Marquee between 4pm and 8pm on the eve of the show and between 8am and 9.55am on the morning of the show) must be shown by each exhibit staged and Exhibitors will be responsible for placing these cards and checking the particulars entered on them. Childrens Section Entries must bear the child's age on the reverse of the Exhibit Card.

6. **PRIZES.** Multiple entries are allowed but no exhibitor may take more than one prize in any class. Judges may withhold any or all the prizes where exhibits are not of sufficient merit. Prize cards must not be removed before 4.30 pm on the day of the Show.

7. **DECISIONS.** The decision of the Judges shall be final as to the relative merits and the decision of the Show Committee shall be final on all matters connected with the show.

8. **PROTESTS.** Any protest must be delivered in writing to the Show Secretary within one hour of the Show being open to the public. A protest must be accompanied by a deposit of £1, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld, but not otherwise.

9. **NAMING OF EXHIBITS.** Judges will take into account the correct naming of varieties.

10. **VASES.** A vase is a container which has greater height than its diameter at the mouth. (See RHS Rules)

11. **THE ALLOTMENT CHALLENGE CUP.** To take part in this challenge, entrants must be allotment holders and must name their allotment association on their entry forms. Exhibits must have been grown on the entrant's allotment or any other land in his/her occupation (e.g., garden).

TROPHIES

All Trophies are held for 12 months. They remain the property of Frenchay and Hambrook Horticultural Society & must be returned to a Committee Member by 30th June of the year following that in which they were won.

THE BANKSIAN MEDAL - Awarded by the R.H.S. to the Exhibitor winning the largest number of classes from 3-101. Winners from the previous two years are not eligible this year

LADIES CUP - awarded to the lady with the most points in classes 3-101

Staging is open, exhibits are viewed all round but judging, under NAFAS rules, is from the front. More than one entry may be included in any Class.

A Novice is an exhibitor who has not previously won first prize.

- Each item on the table to be judged must be numbered (1-5) and where there is an alternative (3&4) state which one is applicable alongside the number (ie.whether Craft or Art work). 20 marks available for each item 1 to 4 and 20 marks available for staging, to include item 5, taking into account presentation, colour co-ordination and interpretation of your theme.

Entries and photographs must be in by the Wednesday immediately before the Show. Not mounted. Maximum size 130mm x 180mm (5"x 7"). Not more than one entry per person per class. Please put your name on the back of all photographs. Please note although care will be taken photographs may be damaged by display method
